	<p>Ineffective breastfeeding</p> <p>Related factors:</p> <p>Dissatisfaction with breastfeeding process</p> <p>Infant anomaly</p> <p>Infant receiving supplemental feedings with artificial nipple</p> <p>Interruption in breastfeeding</p> <p>Knowledge deficit</p> <p>Maternal anxiety or ambivalence</p> <p>Maternal breast anomaly</p> <p>Nonsupportive partner/family</p> <p>Poor infant sucking reflex</p> <p>Prematurity</p> <p>Previous breast surgery</p> <p>Previous history of breastfeeding failure</p> <p>Symptoms / Risk factors:</p> <p>Actual or perceived inadequate milk supply</p> <p>Infant arching and crying at the breast</p> <p>Infant exhibiting fussiness and crying within the first hour</p> <p>Infant inability to attach on to maternal breast correctly</p> <p>Insufficient emptying of each breast per feeding</p> <p>Insufficient opportunity for suckling at the breast</p> <p>No observable signs of oxytocin release</p> <p>Nonsustained suckling at the breast</p> <p>Observable signs of inadequate infant intake</p> <p>Persistence of sore nipples beyond first week of breastfeeding</p> <p>Unresponsive to comfort measures</p> <p>Unsatisfactory breastfeeding process</p> <p>Outcome / Goal:</p> <p>Neonate's nutritional needs will be met</p>		<p>Breastfeeding Assistance</p> <p>Alternate oral and gavage feeding to conserve the neonate's energy</p> <p>Assess infant's ability to suck</p> <p>Assess the mother's desire to resume breastfeeding to plan intervention</p> <p>Assess the need for gavage feeding</p> <p>Consider using Breast Pump in case of infant sucking problems</p> <p>Encourage mother to feed infant frequently</p> <p>Ensure proper positioning for breast feeding</p> <p>Record the number of stools and amount of urine voided each shift</p> <p>Weight the neonate at the same time each day on the same scale</p>
