	<p>Ineffective tissue perfusion:cerebral</p> <p>Related factors: Vascular obstruction Vasospasm</p> <p>Symptoms / Risk factors: Altered mental status Behavioral changes Change in motor or sensory response Language deficit</p> <p>Outcome / Goal: Patient will not exhibit symptoms of neurovascular compromise</p>		<p>Cerebral Perfusion Promotion</p> <p>Assess pupillary responses</p> <p>Avoid situations which can increase ICP</p> <p>Administer anticonvulsants as needed</p> <p>Elevate the head of bed 30 to 45 degr. unless contraindicated</p> <p>Maintain adequate oxygenation to ensure cerebral perfusion</p> <p>Monitor for respiratory irregularities (slowing rate)</p> <p>Monitor for signs and symptoms of increased ICP</p> <p>Monitor vital sign - assess for change</p> <p>Note other symptoms:Headache, vomiting and straining</p> <p>Use Glasgow Coma Scale</p>
