	<p>Risk for aspiration</p> <p>Related factors:</p> <p>Immature cough or gag reflex</p> <p>Symptoms / Risk factors:</p> <p>Decreased gastrointestinal motility</p> <p>Depressed cough and gag reflexes</p> <p>Impaired swallowing</p> <p>Increased intragastric pressure</p> <p>Reduced level of consciousness</p> <p>Outcome / Goal:</p> <p>No signs and symptoms of aspiration</p>		<p>Aspiration Precautions Prevention</p> <p>Withhold oral feedings if signs of respiratory distress occur</p> <p>Regularly assess the neonate's respiratory status until stable</p> <p>Suction as needed to keep airways clear</p> <p>Instruct the parents in feeding techniques</p>
